Objectives

- Helping people to think beyond their individual teams and organisations and recognise the need to connect across our health and care system
- Building open and authentic relationships, based on collaborative power sharing, required for effective system working
- Empowering our people with the agency to work differently and make decisions together

We understand that some people need further details, of what the programme will cover, to help them decide whether this is right for them or which of their team members to recommend this to. Here are some further details to help you decide.

Who is it for? What level is it aimed at?

This really is for everyone working in health and social care within our district. It has been developed upon the philosophy that leadership happens at all levels. There is no hierarchy. This is particularly applicable to system leadership which crosses all organisational and hierarchical boundaries.

What we plan to cover**

DAY ONE

- Providing an overview of the health and wellbeing of our population and our strategic priorities.
- Exploring what is means for you to work in the Wakefield district.
- Exploring system leadership: What is it? How is it different to general leadership? Why do we need system leadership?
- Using system leadership theoretical models to understand our experience and further develop our skills.

DAY TWO

- Participants will have been organised into smaller groups and will undertake some 'Fieldwork'.
- Groups will agree how best to explore each of the roles in your group and work out where and how they all fit into the system and what they do.
- This might include spending time shadowing and or observing each other whilst undertaking their roles, or to spend time in other departments in their organisations.

DAY THREE

- Participants will share their learning from their Fieldwork and explore the challenges of system leadership and strategies to overcome them.
- Further system leadership theoretic frameworks will be introduced to help to frame these.
- We will invite guest speakers to share their experience of system leadership in Wakefield.
- Participants will be invited to explore how they intend on applying their learning with their roles.
